The Universities Council on Water Resources is a multi-disciplinary association of primarily North American universities dedicated to the advancement of research, education and service in water resources. Its principle publication, the *Journal of Contemporary Water Research and Education* (formerly *Water Resources Update*), is an edited, but not generally peer-reviewed, journal published both on paper and in electronic form at www.ucowr.org. *JCWRE* accepts articles by invitation only. Each issue has an invited editor and a specific theme; a list of these issue themes is provided below. Articles published in *JCWRE* are widely recognized for their concise clarity and relevance to critical water resources issues and principles.

PREPARATION OF MANUSCRIPT

Electronic Copy: Papers are to be submitted as Word or Word Perfect documents. Figures and images should be included in these files or as separate .jpg files. If figures are in color, a black-and-white copy should be submitted as well. Submit papers to clant@siu.edu or to the e-mail address of the issue editor.

Title: Titles should properly reflect the contents of the article. The title should be short and informative, and should not exceed 12 words in length.

Author Name and Affiliation: Name of the author(s) should appear after the title along with the affiliation of the author(s).

Text: The manuscript text should be typed double-spaced. The text should be written so that it will be of interest to persons in the wide variety of disciplines represented by UCOWR's membership. Articles average about 8 pages in length as published, 15 pages in manuscript form. Articles do **not** include abstracts. Subheadings in bold should be used.

Acknowledgments: These can be included in a separately titled section, following the text.

Author Bio and Contact Information: An author bio of about 100 words and contact information should be included after the acknowledgments. This should contain author(s) mailing address and e-mail address.

References: Cite references to published literature in the text by author(s) and date: for example, Howe (1984) or (Howe 1984). List all references in alphabetical order in a **References** section. Give the complete title of the reference and the source. Use the styles shown below:

Tables: Tables should be numbered consecutively and include a brief but descriptive title. Use a separate page for each table, and include all tables after the References section. Mark in the margin of the text where each table is first noted in text. The table will appear in the manuscript as soon as possible after it is first mentioned in the text unless there is a place specified by you that you would prefer it be placed.

Figures: JCWRE publishes figures only in black and white (gray scales as well), although the electronic version may contain figures in color. Figures are to be a minimum resolution of 225 dpi. Figures in color should be submitted in CMYK color scheme and should be submitted as black-and-white as well. Figures should be placed following tables with one figure on each page. They can also be submitted as separate .jpg files. The figure will appear in the manuscript as soon as possible after it is first mentioned in the text unless there is a place specified by you that you would prefer it be placed.

Appendices: All appendices must have a title. The Appendix is placed at the end of the text after *Author (s) Bio* and before the *References*.

Author Information Sheet: Please provide all of the information requested on this form shown below (the form may be duplicated, if needed).

Copyright Release Form: EACH AUTHOR is required to complete a Copyright Release Form.
